

The Elliott Community will become the first long-term care home in Guelph accredited in The Butterfly Approach, an innovative, personcentered and emotion-focused model of care. The Butterfly Approach has been introduced on the Wellington, Fountain and Edinburgh home areas on the third floor in Long-term care.

Butterfly Accreditation Update

We are pleased to share that based on their observations on May 6 and 7, the Meaningful Care Matters (MCM) team has confirmed that The Elliott Community has reached their benchmark for accreditation in The Butterfly Approach and will become the very first Butterfly home in the City of Guelph! Thank you and congratulations to the teams on Wellington, Fountain and Edinburgh for the hard work and commitment that have demonstrated throughout this journey.

In addition to the observational audit, MCM is also reviewing a 100 points environmental checklist, clinical documents, policies and other supporting documents that we have provided. Once this review is complete we will receive a full report along with the level of accreditation we have achieved. We expect to receive this report in 6-8 weeks. We will share more details and communicate this achievement more broadly at that time.

We are working on a plan to spread this culture change to other areas of long-term care and across the organization and look forward to sharing more information soon.

INFECTION CONTROL & PREVENTION UPDATE



Bite-Free & Bug-Smart in LTC!

As spring warms up and we start enjoying the outdoors more, it's important to stay alert to seasonal infection risks—especially those related to bug bites and outdoor activities.

In long-term care, residents are more vulnerable to illnesses spread by insects like mosquitoes and ticks, which can carry viruses such as West Nile and Lyme disease. Here's how we can stay safe this spring!

Outdoor Safety Tips for Residents and Staff

- Apply insect repellent when heading outdoors (especially near grass or wooded areas).
- ✓ Wear long sleeves and pants when walking in gardens, near trees, or tall grass.
 - Check for ticks after outdoor activities—focus on hairlines, underarms, behind knees, and around waistbands.
 - Avoid standing water around the home, as it attracts mosquitoes.
 Skin Care & Bite Prevention in LTC
 - ✓ Daily skin checks for residents can help detect bug bites early and reduce the risk of infection.
 - Keep residents comfortable and covered when enjoying time outside.
 - Use window screens and door closures to keep bugs out of indoor spaces.

- X Myth: "You'll always feel it if a tick bites you."
- ✓ Fact: Tick bites are often painless and can go unnoticed. That's why routine skin checks are important after time spent outdoors—even short walks!

By following these simple practices, we can enjoy a safe and healthy spring while protecting residents from seasonal risks.
