"At the heart of the model is the belief that people thrive when they feel safe, loved, and able to express their individuality," he said.

The official accreditation was granted following a recent qualitative audit conducted by Meaningful Care Matters (MCM) on May 6 and 7, 2025, across three home areas – Wellington, Fountain, and Edinburgh – and resulted in an overall rating of Level 1 - 'Excellent'. Meaningful Care Matters specializes in helping organizations to access a variety of services facilitating the effective and sustainable implementation of person-centred care models, for the health, social/aged, and disability care settings.

"Meaningful Care Matters is proud to partner with The Elliott Community and to celebrate their success in achieving an 'Excellent' accreditation in their recent audit following the implementation of The Butterfly Approach," said Peter Bewert, Managing Director of Meaningful Care Matters.
