- A Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing.
- Current Nurse Practitioner Registration with the College of Nurses of Ontario in the Extended Class, with a preferred Master's Degree and the ability to prescribe narcotics and controlled substances.
- A minimum of 2 years clinical experience in the care of geriatric clients and adult chronic disease management.

- Collaboration with the resident and family/caregiver, and the health care team in the development, implementation and evaluation of the residents plan of care.

- Leadership and collaboration in research, education, and evidence-based practice initiatives to optimize the resident, LTCH and health system outcomes.

- Assessment and ongoing monitoring of residents with complex care needs and/or altered health status.
